

Nothing Ever Happens on a Gray Day


GRANT SNIDER


Grief is an Elephant








You Rule

The Bear who went to War

In the dark days of war, a group of soldiers far from home come across an orphaned bear cub. They adopt him and hide him in their tents, feeding him with their rations - until he is too big to ignore! When they are told he cannot travel with them, they grant him an officer's commission. Private Wojtek finds himself helping to carry armaments at the fierce Battle of Monte Cassino. After the war, unable to return to their homeland, the band of soldiers arrive in Edinburgh, Scotland. Peter, Wojtek's substitute parent, has no idea where his own family, forced out of their home, can be. There is a happy ending, however, as Peter is reunited with his family in Scotland - and Wojtek finds a new home in Edinburgh zoo. A statue of Wojtek stands in Princes Street Gardens in Edinburgh in memory of the brave bear and his fellow soldiers.

Alan Pollock is a playwright, best known for *One Night* in November, about the Coventry blitz. He came across the story of Wojtek while researching amongst Polish refugees in Coventry. The youth of the soldiers involved in the Battle of Monte Cassino moved him to write for children for the first time. **Bryony Thomson**'s self-authored debut picture book, *The Wardrobe Monster*, was published by Old Barn Books in 2018. She explores a totally different illustration style for this story.


A new book from award-winning illustrator **Mariajo Ilustrajo**, *Lost* is the story of a polar bear who finds himself lost, in a big concrete city.







This is the follow-up to I Love My Bike and is the second in a picture-book series based on first experiences and the magic in the everyday.







Transposed into pictures that are entirely in blue and (almost) exclusively drawn with biros, they produce a very special effect and surprise the reader with their different interpretative approaches. Respect and tolerance, trust and reliability, the acceptance of diversity ... everything that makes good social interaction possible in the first place, is packed into a picture book.

Run, Little Sparrow!

An encouragement book in the best sense of the word.

Sparrow and mouse are good friends, play and laugh together, and have a great time. But one day it happens: Spatz is injured during a strong thunderstorm. Despite rapid help from the raven, it quickly becomes clear that everything is different from now on. One of the two wings does not heal completely, remains lame, unable to fly. All of a sudden, Spatz is faced with a situation that turns his old, everyday habits upside down and requires a completely new path. This makes you discouraged and desperate, leads to the big question "why" and questions your own identity: "I'm not a real bird anymore!"

Ultimately, however, Spatz has no choice but to acknowledge this reality and gradually approach the new situation. "Run instead of fly" is now the motto. Raven and mouse support him, encourage setbacks and are happy about progress. Sparrow will always love to fly, but being able to run through the meadow with the mouse is a good alternative.

Brigitte Weninger talks sensitively and gently about how courage can be regained after a profound trauma. Anna Zeh puts the story in a realistic setting with a fine line, but creates the characters with a lot of character and kindness.



An Ice-cold Fish

The death of the beloved pet (fish Onno) is very sad, but it also gives the young boy the most beautiful day in his life. Walls that protect and separate, that secure and constrict at the same time. Walls that become a new, unwanted living space for an indefinite period of time.

The two artists encounter this horror and this new reality of life from the perspective of a girl. The family seeks refuge underground, taking the bare necessities with them and huddling together there. A "living burrow" like that of the mole, whom the girl had previously met in the garden and with whom she experienced an unusual closeness, who has the softest fur in the world.

In short, condensed sections, this book tells of a child who has to move her everyday life underground and tries to deal with this new situation. With fantasy and comfort, with memories and an unshakeable hope.

A gentle book on an unfortunately very topical subject.
