
Musical Forest

ABOUT THE AUTHORS

Cao Wenxuan grew up in rural China and is now a professor of Chinese literature and children's literature. He is the author of several celebrated books for young readers, including the novel *Bronze and Sunflower*, which received three starred reviews. His fluid, poetic prose depicts honest, sometimes raw, and often melancholy moments of life. He has also received significant recognition for his academic research and teaching in the field of children's literature, and he was the first Chinese author to win the Hans Christian Andersen Author Award.

Wanwan was born in Hunan. In 2007, she graduated from the Central Academy of Fine Arts. In 2011, her original picture book *Black Rice Got Lost* received the Excellence Award at the 2nd Hsin-Yi Picture Book Awards. Her picture book *Play with Me* was selected as one of the 2015 Beautiful Picture Books by the China Library Society. She also collaborated with Qin Wenjun on the picture book *Grandma's Big Cat and Little Cat*. Her work *Big-Footed Girl* won the 2016 Zhang Leping Picture Book Award. Some of her works have been selected for the Singapore Children's Literature Festival.





ABOUT THE BOOK





Walking Path


The Summer Night Concert

ABOUT THE BOOK

The Summer Night Concert is a heartwarming neighborhood tale that depicts how people embrace a wondrous evening during a power outage, seeking romance and warmth amidst their ordinary lives. Set in a quaint southern town of the 1990s, this story draws inspiration from the real-life experiences of the artist Han Han. At its center are the music-loving Xiao Mi family, whose melodious tunes and joyful spirits captivate the hearts of their neighbors, transforming an otherwise mundane summer night. Gradually, the initially irritable residents, vexed by the lack of electricity and sweltering heat, transition from mere spectators to active participants. Together, they cast aside the weariness and burdens of everyday life. When power is eventually restored, everyone resumes their usual routines, yet a newfound sense of joy lingers in the air.



Han Han, whose real name is Han Xian, is a native of Hunan and was born in 1983. In 2004, she graduated from Guangzhou Academy of Fine Arts, majoring in printmaking, and in 2007, graduated from the Department of Printmaking, Central Academy of Fine Arts, majoring in contemporary illustration and media, under the supervision of Professor You Jindong, mainly researching various art forms related to illustration, such as handmade books, original picture books, book illustrations, etc.








Old Granny Found Twelve Little Tiger Cats






Summer Stories

My Invisible Dad








ABOUT THE AUTHOR
